Description of the programme: The Good Governance Programme aims to improve in an integrated way the effectiveness and transparency of public administration in the Czech Republic through a multi-layered effort to review and reform its components, based on international methodologies and best practices.

The focus of the programme will be on (1) the system of administration and quality of public services, (2) the integrity and effectiveness of anti-corruption measures, and (3) the effectiveness of the law enforcement authorities, including anti-money laundering measures. The goals in the main focus areas of the Programme will be achieved by five pre-defined projects (PDPs) and a small grant scheme (SGS).

The PDPs will cover areas that were identified by Czech stakeholders as important, under-funded and eligible for funding by the EEA Grants. SGS projects will be aimed at strengthening participatory decisionmaking at the local level and will intend to promote bilateral cooperation with relevant bodies (especially municipalities) in the Donor States.

Bilateral cooperation: The Programme will contribute to the exchanging and sharing of knowledge, experience and best practice between Czech public institutions and entities from the Donor States. Some of the PDPs and SGS projects will establish bilateral partnership.
